Dear Catholic Charities Donor,

We have good news. Once again, Catholic Charities of Bloomington has been selected to participate in the Indiana Neighborhood Assistance Program (NAP) which means that donors who fulfill a few simple requirements are eligible to receive a credit on their state taxes.

NAP credits are assigned to organizations that serve economically disadvantaged populations.

Starting July 1, 2016, any donation of at least \$100 to Catholic Charities of Bloomington will quality you to receive a state income tax credit of up to 50% of your total contribution as long as NAP credits are available. This is how it works: If you make a \$100 donation, you will receive a \$50 tax credit, or if you make a \$1,000 donation, you will receive a \$500 tax credit. A limited number of NAP credits are awarded each year and distributed on a first come, first served basis. The state imposes a series of deadlines, which means it's important to keep an eye on the calendar. We have \$12,381 in credits to sell (\$24,762 in donations), and we must sell 60% by December 31.

If you choose to donate, and if you would like your donation to count for NAP credits, please fill out the Donor Contribution form and donor acknowledgment form (both located here) and mail them to Catholic Charities of Bloomington along with your donation. Our agency will file your completed documents with the Indiana Department of Revenue, and you will receive a voucher with the tax credit in time for your annual tax returns.

We are deeply grateful for your support of Catholic Charities Bloomington. Thanks to your generosity, we are able to change lives every day, replace despair with hope, and show our clients options they never imagined. It is work that we are committed to, and it is work that we could not do without you.
