# Vietnam confusion

The two most overworked \$5 words about Vietnam "escalation" and "commitment."

Escalation is a four-syllable euphemism meaning to widen the war. Last spring President Johnson said he didn't seek a wider war. It since has widened im-

Commitment has two meanings: (1) troops are committed to battle; (2) the country is committed to this or that role in Vietnam.

There is a great deal of disagreement about the second meaning, and somebody should clear it up once and for all.

For example, it repeatedly is claimed in some cir-cles that we are legally and morally committed under the 1954 Geneva Agreements. The fact is, as Gary MacEoin points out in his column on this page, neither the United States nor Victnam ever signed the Geneva the United St Agreements.

MacEoin makes the further point that there is a whale of a difference between a binding treaty agreement and the sort of 'commitment' that originates with administrative statements of policy and intention.

In short, President Johnson could not either legally or morally commit this country to limitless war and limitless objectives in Vietnam. Any effort to do so would amount to a unilateral declaration of war, a right and a duty constitutionally reserved to Congress under Section 8, Article 1.

At a press conference this past week-end Mr. John-son again made reference to the congressional Tonkin Gulf resolution of September, 1964, which authorized intervention in Southeast Asia long before the extent of the intervention became clear.

Then the President commented that in his opinion he could push on in Vietnam without any congressional resolution. After all, he said, he ordered the Navy to open fire in the Tonkin Gulf before the resolution was passed.

There is a vast, fateful difference, however, between the Commander-in-Chief having the authority to order the Navy to fire in a self-defense or retallatory situation and the authority to pursue a war of indeterminate size, this without any action whatever by Congress.

Secretary of State Rusk is among those who con-stantly speak of our "commitment" in Vietnam, always implying that any hesitancy about "secalation" would be a repudiation of our sacred word and a disastrous blot on our national honor.



I asked a priest abo

The Mass prayers they say now I have learned by heart, and why should I give up my Rosary? I never will. I made a solemn promise to the Blessed Virgin that I would asy the Rosary every day of my life. What I cannot understand is why the Rosary now is not a proper prayer at Mass, especially when you are blind?

A. Say your Rosary every day with devotion and meditation. But why do you have to say it at Mass? Can't you find any other time of the day for it? If you know the Mass prayers by heart, why not say them during Mass? Are they more monotonous than the Rosary?

For a person who is blind and finds no Mass prayers to say the Rosary during Mass might be all right. But for anyone else it is a delib-erate distraction from the most sacred prayer and action which we, the People of God, per-form in union with Jesus Christ.

In former years priests who assisted at holy Mass usually read their breviary during it, pausing only during the sermon—maybe—and at the Consecration. Now it is rare that a priest reads his breviary during Mass. The Mass is important congle to merit our attention and our






