

But what does he have to say about the prospect of a durable democracy in Victiam? He has cheered this stated American war aim.

Does South Vietnam offer any real hope of becoming a durable democratic republic in the visible future? It has no more of the complex qualities and experiences that go to make lasting freedom than the African nations have

In its effort to bring the terrible war in Vietnam to a close, the United States should rethink its aims, ruling out efforts to reform the world by force of arms. These aims should be in terms of a successful de-escalation that will preserve our legitimate and obtainable interests in Asia without risking a holocaust over one variety of Communism.

What's more, the administration has progressed well beyond the 1964 proposal of stripping jungle cover for the enemy.

According to the State Department report, more than 20,000 acres of South Victuamese crops have been destroyed. The report adds that the crops were incuded to feed enemy troops, but also says that "innocent" perties in the chemically-devastated areas were warned ahead of time and assured that they would be fed by the South Victnamese government.

The only conclusion is that those same crops would have fed innocent peasants and villagers as well.

But the widespread and prolonged use of such chemicals have by no means been acquitted of long-term effects, despite the State Department's claim that the herbicides are "non-toxic" Just how they can be "non-toxic" and still be called "herbicides" or "killers of plant life" is not explained.

The immediate military advantage to be gained from defoliation is obvious. Less clear, however, is whether chemical warfare of this sort fits into this country's parallel efforts to effect a social and economic revolution that will benefit the Vietnamese.

Most Americans didn't think it fit in 1964. What do they think now? And what will they think about nuclear bombing six months from now if progress in the war continues to go slowly?






