

Wine of triumph

Organized labor, for too long now, has been acquire the public image of a fatted protective association those who already "have it made."

What happened to the bold and daring spirit that used to win great victories for the poor and the oppressed, and thereby helped mightily to make America history's most affluent nation?

Perhaps the union movement will regain some of its old-time crusading zeal from the example of the remarkable Cesar Chavez and his National Farm Workers Association. The NFWA finally has won a major breakthrough in its determined eight-month-old strike of grape pickers in the Delano (Calif.) vineyard district.

It now appears inevitable that the dramatic under-dog effort of the NFWA and its friends will win bargain-ing rights for the ill-paid, exploited grape workers throughout the Delano region.

This, in turn, will lead eventually to organizing rights for farm laborers everywhere, including the 20,000 impoverished migrants in Indiana. And it will lead at long last to righting an ancient injustice—exclusion of farm workers from National Labor Relations Board recognition.

The Delano strike, therefore, must be ranked among America's great labor pushes.

However, you'd never know that from the inattention given it by the secular press in Indianapolis and nearly everywhere else.

The Packer, a weekly newspaper which bills itself as the national voice of the fresh fruit and vegetable industry, has been more attentive. In a "news story" in its April 9 issue, for example, it portrayed the grape growers as having "withstood attacks by union organizers, social do-gooders and plain and fancy rabble rousers."

We don't know whether the multitude of American Catholic bishops, other priests and clergymen of other faiths who have actively supported the Delano strikers are social do-gooders or rabble-rousers (plain or fancy) in the Packer's view.

Nonetheless, the widespread assistance of organized religion in this unique and inspiring strike has been a decisive factor in sustaining the grape pickers.

This has resulted in a few lively ecclesiastical exchanges among Catholics and complaints from growers' representatives that clergymen should tend to their pulpits and leave "politics" to others.

That, of course, is not the view of Vatican II's Constitution on the Church in the Modern World, which states that "principles of justice and equity demanded by right reason both for individual and social life and international life" are a primary concern of religion.

We hope Big Labor is inspired by the Delano movement to recapture more of the same outlook.

But where have the AFL-CIO and other large unions been all these years in militantly organizing migrant farm laborers and millions of other in lipaid, unskilled and mis-generated workers? Why do they represent only 10 per cent of all white-collar employees in the country, many of whom certainly need somebody to speak for them? What about rampant Jim Crowism in so many unions—this in the face of fine anti-discrimination speeches by their top brass?

Canon law formerly imposed a penalty of excommunication on Catholics who attempted marriage before a Protestant minister. The recent Instruction from Rome did away with this excommunication, and made it retreactive, so that those who were excommunicated for this reason are now absolved from that penalty. But this does not mean that the Church recognizes their marriages as valid. A Catholic can be validly married only before a priest and two witnesses; and a person who is, with full knowledge, living in an invalid marrial union may not receive the sacraments.



The Jesuit ousier was part of a campaign against the Church started in 1959 by the Haltian regime of President Francois Duvaller, which has since resuled in the expulsion of the nation's three bishops and numerous priests. In 1961 everyone who had anything to do with the bishops' expulsions was excommunicated by the Holy See.
