The bishop said that this is especially The bishop said that this is especially true of Marian devotions for the month of May. Some of these are out of line with the teaching of the Bible, he said, while others are not in harmony with the ecumenical council's requirement that the liturgy be Christ-centered.

Noting that May devotions fall within the Easter season, Bishop Kampe asserted that they must be imbued with the spirit of the Resurrection liturgy, and that this can be done

without downgrading the rightful place of St.

The Limburg prelate spoke at a time when German Catholics were speaking both for and against traditional veneration of the Blessed Virgin.

One by-product of the dispute was the arrest of two young men who allegedly destroyed a statue of the Virgin which had been errected on the outside wall of their parish church in Dusestdorf two years searlier. 

Comment

The Pope's speech

Pope Paul's address to representatives of Christian labor on the 75th anniversary of the publication of Rerum Novarum has immediate significance. No doubt it also will become the subject of long-range debate within the Church.

An outspoken condemnation of Marxism, the talk was viewed partly as an attempt to influence the Italian national elections slated for June 12.

But much broader implications will be deduced.

Ultra-conservatives, still chafing from Mater et Magistra and Pacem in Terris, likely will take comfort from what they will interpret as a dilution, or perhaps even a refutation, of the Johannine messages which electrified modern Catholic thought. Or even the principles of social justice outlined in Pope Leo XIII's famous encyclical, which has served as a lodestar for the development of modern socio-economic thought.

The Pope said the Church has not and cannot ad-The Pope said the Church has not and cannot ad-here to "social, ideological and political movements which, in finding their origins and strength in Marxism, have maintained its negative principles and methods, which result from the incomplete and therefore false conception of man, history and the world which is typical of radical Marxism."

Further, that "materialism which comes from atheism" snuffs out "true spirituality and transcendent hopes."

So what's new? one might ask a bit irreverently. What's new is that the ultra-conservatives will seize upon Pope Paul's calling a spade a spade and—by simplistic interpretation—equate his address with their own quaint philosophy: all the evils of the world are attributable to Communism; Communism must be destroyed by whatever means.

stroyed by whatever means.

The "social, ideological and political movements" alluded to by the Pope will, by a curious extension of ultra-conservative dogma, have come to include labor unions, trade with Communist countries, social walfare, and civil rights legislation of any shape or form.

The warning against Marxism, however, was only an affirmation, not a change of mind or of emphasis.

Catholic doctrin always has held God as the bal-ance wheel of all human endeavor and progress. Vati-can II's Pastoral Constitution on the Church in the Mod-ern World repudiated again the class struggle theory of Marxism and reiterated the stand that men can effectively promote secie-economic development only by defending the claims of all men to justice and charity and by observing the order of values established by Christ and set forth in His Gospel.

The human city is enriched and dignified only by seeking first the kingdom of God. This has been, and still is, the central theme of Catholic social justice!

Neither Communism in 20th-century Russia nor laissez-faire capitalism of 19th century Britain reflected that theme. And both have been soundly rejected by the Church.

Pope Paul's bluntness on this occasion may irk those who prefer to eschew all the old familiar fighting words. But his message gives no cause for rejoicing to those awaiting a reversal of the Johannine direction. They wait in vain.

This week Msgr. Harrold A. Murray, director of the bureau of health and hospitals, National Catholic Welfare Conference, pointed the finger of shame at the 1.500 hospitals in this country, mostly in the South, which do not qualify under the Medicare program because of continued segregation.

Medicare, he explained, will not pay bills in a hepital which is not wholly integrated as to race, color and national origin. He urged that all Catholic laymen make their feelings known in any community where any hospital continues to practice segregation. (No hospital in Indianapolis or—so far as we have learned—elsewhere in the Archicesse has declined to comply with the integration provisions of Medicare.

But even if these 1,500 segregated hospitals even-tually are brought into the fold, the crisis will be but slightly diminished.

Additional medical facilities and medical personnel simply cannot be provided rapidly enough to avert a crisis.

Right now in Indianapolis and other communities where hospital fund drives of various sorts are in progress, corporations, foundations and individuals should give as generously as possible. Every new hospital bed is invaluable, wherever and however it is built.

The country also should get behind new legislation committing the federal government to a \$1.8 billion program to provide 200,000 long-care beds for the aged.

Even this will not dissipate the crisis. Much broad-er, bolder legislation is needed.

Except for those physicians who flatly refuse to co-operate in the Medicare program, the time for recrim-inations against the American Medical Association is past.

Ralph McGill suggested in his Sunday column in the Indianapolis Star that the AMA and related medical organizations could perform no finer service for the nation than to take the lead in pushing measures to in-crease medical facilities and personnel, whether in the private or public sector.

McGill added: "We need to hurry."

Extra! Dodo dies

If the fear's expressed by Msgr. George Higgins in his Criterion column this week were to materialize, the day might come when we would not dare print anything more controversial than an editorial chiding litterbugs.

Nonethe less, government officialdom taken as a whole tends to have a syndromic fear of a free press and to favor controls.
