Rights of accused

Much nonsense hase been uttered and written, in Indianapolis and elsewhere, about how the U.S. Suprement Court virtually has given carte blanche to rampate criminality in its recent so-called Miranda decision.

**Catholic ultra-rightists shy away from any diatribes about heresy and concentrate instead on dubbing the movement a "political action group that parrots the liberal line"—or worse.

Briefly stated, what the high tribunal ordered in an admittedly close and complex decision was this:

Before police question a prisoner they must tell him clearly that he does not have to answer, that he is entitled to a lawyer and that, if he cannot afford one, the state will supply one

It seems to us that all the court did was to enunciate once gain the rights of the individual that always have been his under the Constitution. Only this time those rights have been spelled out in a way that they no longer can be conveniently ignored.

The Indianapolis Star recently published a posthu-The Indianapolis Star recently published a postna-mous series of stories written by a valiant and enter-prising young reporter. Stephen A. Haynes. For two weeks Mr. Haynes lived on Skid Row in the capital city and contrived to get himself arrested and jailed on a charge of drunkenness. He was killed in an auto acci-dent just before his series was due to be published.

Mr. Haynes' articles told a lot about the habitually casual attitude of police, courts of lower jurisdiction, and jailers toward the rights of society's castoffs. The series has resulted in some hasty "tidying up" in Marion County. But what about other counties in the state and nation, where the poor, the derelicts, and minority groups customarily suffer a loss of constitutional rights at the hands of law enforcement officers and courts?

The Miranda decision was in keeping with President ennedy's classic warning that "the freedom of all men diminished when the rights of one man are denied."

And, as to the well-organized outcries that the Su-preme Court is encouraging an increase in the crime rate, that pillar of wisdom in the Pittsburgh Catholic. Msgr. Charles Owen Rice, an old hand in dealing with criminals, police and courts, has this to say:

"It is utterly and completely ridiculous and naive to say that vigilance for constitutional rights encourages crime. Does the person committing a crime of impulse or passion reflect on his possible punishment or on the state of constitutional law? Of course, not. Again, the professional criminal is not encouraged by solicitude for the rights of the accused. He has always known how to get his rights, and needs no encouragement to press on with his career."

The Miranda decision doubtless will cause many police some initial difficulties. They have been accustomed to shortcuts to law enforcement that shortchange citizens' rights. But the end product will be better play enforcement, not a tip of the police and better law enfor scales in favor of criminality




