# Instruction issued AUG 26 1966 as a guideline for HUBBARY'S interfaith efforts

WASHINGTON — Suggested procedures for Catholic dioceses and parishes considering membership in councils of churches are contained in a document issued jointly by the Catholic Bishops' Commission for Ecumenical Affairs and the National Council of Churches.

The document recommends an extended period of "mutual preparation" by Entholic diocesses or parishes and councils of churches prior to actual Catholic membership. But after such preparation, it says, it is possible for a Catholic body to "join wholeheartedly."

# The agitators

The maneuvering and voting on the 1966 Civil Rights Bill in the House was a measure of the anti-Negro bias existing in this country today. Every member of the House is up for re-election this November. His vote, particularly on the all-important open housing section of the bill, may be taken as a realistic appraisal of the way his constituency feels about the matter.

And we haven't seen anything yet. Wait until Senator Everett Dirksen and his friends get their hands on the hill

The bill finally passed the House by the narrowest margin for a major civil rights measure in recent years —259 to 157. And this was only after Title IV, the open housing section, had been watered down to exclude individual home sales and rentals, as well as making several other exceptions to the sweeping ban on housing discrimination originally sought by the administration.

The most revealing vote was on an amendment which would have restored the measure to something resembling what the administration had asked for, exempting only boarding houses and owner-occupied dwellings where three units or less were rented. That amendment was killed by a 186-to-76 vote. In short, fewer than one-fifth of congressmen were willing to vote to ban racial discrimination in housing.

Now the bill goes to the Senate and will face much stiffer opposition. For one thing, Senator Dirksen has threatened to attach his controversial school prayer amendment to the measure as a "rider."

Cynically, he asked at a press conference: "The right to pray is a civil right, isn't it?" He then suggested that the prayer amendment might make a good substitute for the fair housing section, which he altogether opposes. He pulled a similar stunt last year with his reapportionment bill, bringing it to the Senate floor by hooking it to an American Legion Baseball Week resolution.

We doubt that Dirksen's stunt will get any further than the one last year did. But the fact that he even considers such a move worthy of the United States Senate is a measure of the animosity toward meaningful open housing existing in the upper house.

Meanwhile, Negro Americans are hearing lectures: President Johnson on their social responsibilities not stir up trouble with street demonstrations and the

"The Department of Justice has looked very care-ully into the causes of the riots," Katzenbach testified We conclude that they were indeed fronted by agitators -agitators named disease and despair, joblessness and opelessness, rat-infested housing, and long impacted vnicism."

Katzenbach might well have named another agitato—an American Congress unwilling to tear down hatefughetto walls.
