Comment

The opinions expressed in these editorial columns represent a Catholic viewpoint—not necessarily THE Catholic viewpoint. They are efforts of the editors to serve public opinion within the Church and within the Nation.

The why of it

By and large, the popular press pays scant atten-tion to the religious press. Inasmuch as we and most other religious publications are quite respectfully heed-ful of the goings-on in the world of secular publishing, this inattentiveness seems rather journalistically unecu-mented.

Hence, we were pleased last week to note an entusiastic editorial salute in the Indianapolis News to a new Catholic magazine. Triumph, just launched by a group of laymen.

The best known of Triumph's board of editors is L. Brent Bozell, a brother-in-law of William Buckley and formerly a senior editor of Buckley's ultra-conservative National Review.

Bozell, like Buckley, long has felt—erroneously, in our opinion—that progressives have a hammerlock on Catholic opinion. And he has been highly critical of the renewal resulting from Vatican II.

As Bozell explains it, Triumph's mission is to "has-ten the day of Christ's final triumph over the world." This indeed is a weighty assignment and one to be shared by all Christians everywhere.

The News says editorially that "the workings of the social gospel." and the "crosion of ancient truth and traditional piety" have been troubling "conservative laymen and clergy" of all faiths. It interprets Trimph's point of view as one "which in doctrinal terms translates to traditional Catholicism as rooted in the teachings of St. Thomas and St. Augustine." adding that "it. (Triumph) takes a stance in direct opposition to current efforts to make over the church in terms of secularist impulse."

At this point we must, in all charity, comment that the wave editorialist has managed a triumph of illogic which suggests an imperfect grasp of the theological and historical underpinnings of the Cathoic Church and of the recent developments sparked by Vatican II.

Else, how could he reach the apparent conclusion that post-conciliar renewal somehow is the antithesis of the teachings of St. Thomas (Aquinas, we presume, not Becket or More) and St. Augustine?

not Becket or More) and St. Augustine.

St. Thomas Aquinas and St. Augustine, two among the Church's most venerated saints, were separated in time by more than eight centuries. Their modes of life and their life experiences differed substantially, as did many of their philosophical approaches to the Paith and the conclusions drawn therefrom. Furthermore, many centuries of Church history and change stand between their time on earth and the present.

"Traditional Catholicism" is no more "rooted" in the particular teachings of St. Thomas Aquinas or St. Augustine than it is in those of many other great saints.

Catholic doctrine is much too complex to be dismissed in simplistic terms evidently aimed at making it appear that it is an unchanging and unchangeable product of a long-ago and non-existent St. Barry Goldwater and St. Ronald Reagan.

As to the editorialist's apparently disapproving ref-erences to the "social gospel," we could defend it with numerous references to "ancient truth and traditional piety." beginning with the Golden Rule and the Ten Commandments, then working through the teachings of Jesus, then quoting from St. Augustine and St. Thomas Aquinas. Then we could jump forward in time and quote Pope John's denunciation of "he division between the spiritual and the secular, and dwell at length on the well-publicized utterances of Pope Paul.

But we're not trying here to "throw the book" at anybody. We'll simply quote from a recent speech by a "mere" archibishop—Archibishop—Patrick A. O'Boyle of Washington. His subject was the inseparability of the apostolate of social reform and the quest for the kingdom of God.

"What is needed," Archbishop O'Boyle said, "is not less prayer and less liturgical worship on the one hand, or less involvement in the temporal order on the other, but more of each and a dynamic synthesis of the two."

That, dear friends of Triumph and the News, is what Vatican II was all about.

Under Army regulations the trio was guilty. After all, they were in uniform and refused to obey orders. Judging from newspaper stories concerning the trials, there could have been no other verdict but guilty.

But the legality of our commitment in Vietnam and the fact that we are fighting a war without the constitutional requirement of a congressional declaration bothers a large segment of the civilian population as well. And, like the Army judges, the leaders of the Johnson administration refuse even to consider the argument.


