The disastrous delay in coping with our No. I health problem cannot be interpreted as a lack of understanding or knowledge. Newspapers, radio and television for years have exposed the horrible conditions that prevail at many of the state institutions for the ill and the retarded. The Indianapolis News has just completed a hard-hitting series by Mike Brooks that outlined the severity of need that exists throughout the whole antiquated system.

One of the ironic twists of a public change of attitude toward mental illness has been the increasing willingness of the ill voluntarily to seek hospitalization and the mushrooming demands of families—no longer feeling the stigma of shame that once surrounded mental illness—wanting psychiatric care and treatment for one of their members. As a result, the state-wide waiting list now numbers more than 1,500 persons.

Present facilities are operating at 30 per cent over capacity. And some of those facilities are relies of the 19th century that have received only piecemeal patching and restoration through the years. Many of the institutions are so badly decayed and poorly maintained that it is impossible to observe even the most elementary rules of hygiene and sanitation.

But, perhaps even worse than scandalous house-keeping, is the critical shortage of personnel. The pay scale for personnel is based on a depressed economy. When jobs are plentful elsewhere, only employment "leftovers" look to the institutions. Nothing short of sheer altruium moves the skilled, the capable, the recognized professionals into Indiana's mental health field.

Doctor-patient ratio is one to 169. Kansas has one doctor for every 23 patients. Our national ratio ranking is 35th. The state ranks 22nd in the amount each citizen spends a year (85.29) to support mental hospitals.
