



### 'Do-nothingism'

Six long years ago your Archdiocesan newspaper published the first genuinely penetrating series of articles on the Indianapolis housing situation to appear in al Indianapolis-hased publication. An introductory editors' note explained that inadequate housing was overlooked but grave, family-shattering moral problem that "could be found in Indianapolis, Jeffersonville, Ind., or any other American city."

The series was written by Michael Bowles, a widely traveled and gifted native of Ireland who then was a member of the staff, but who in more recent years has been a professor of music at the University of Birmingham, England.

Mr. Bowles thoroughly investigated the housing problem in Indianapolis with the fresh eyes and lack of preconceived notions of a relative newcomer. His findings stripped away the roseate veil covering the low-income housing crisis, particularly as it applied to Negroes. His considered conclusion was that official and civic do-nothingism, an overblown faith in laissez-faire free enterprise, and an almost pathological fear of federal aid were much to blame. Also, of course, the resistance to open housing.

In the succeeding six years Indianapolis has been maturing in a number of ways. For the most part, it has lost its fear of the federal bogeyman, and it has come to realize that co-operation between private enterprise and government is essential in getting many

Last week, however, two other enterprising reporters, Harrison J. Ullmann and Lynn Dunson, presented a series of articles in the Indianapolis Star showing that the housing crisis has adarmingly worsened since 1960, chiefly due to the pressures of evictions for highway and university construction projects in the inner city.

In their series, the Star reporters did not use the term "do-nothingism," nor had Mr. Bowles six years earlier. But we hereby use it.

There is hope now, however, that public office-holders and other professional and amateur politicians are beginning to come alive. All you have to do these days, it seems, is to threaten sluggish Northern politicians with a non-violent protest march by Dr. March Luther King, and they jump as though they had been poked in the pants by an Alabama sheriff's electric cattle prod.

In Indianapolis an organization known as the Homes Before Highways Committee has been making such a threat. This already has generated some fairly straight talk. If not yet concrete action, by political leaders who heretofore have seemed remarkably complacent about the plight of 20,500 persons facing eviction from their homes.

These 20,500 are those whose dwelling places lie in the paths of Interstates 65 and 70 in the city or on land to be occupied by the Indiana-Purdue University regional campus. Most of them are Negroes. Most are poor.




