### The UN and peace

Senator Mike Mansfield of Montana cannot be fairly classified as either a "dove" or a "hawk" in respect to the Vietnam war. By and large, he has supported administration policies, but has not hesitated to be critical when he felt criticism was in order.

This posture lends all the more weight to the Senator's appeal of last week for a "cards on the table" United Nations Security Council session on the Vietnam war with all interested parties invited, including Peking, Hanoi and the Viet Cong as well as Saigon.

The senator is right in criticizing the UN for lack of action on the war. In fairness to the UN, however, it has had the rug pulled out from under it a couple of times when it appeared ready to explore the idea of a conference of some sort.

Senator Mansfield, of course, will catch it from the win-the-war crowd for suggesting a conference that includes Red China, Hanoi and the Vict Cong. But a conference without them would be worse than meaningless. Moreover, there is precedent for such a conference without them to the meaningless of the U.N. was invited to appear before the Security Council to state its position on the Korean conflict and accepted.

It is true that up to now both China and North Viet-nam have denounced any UN peace-making role. Also, the Soviet bloc has helped prevent the UN from com-ing to grips with the Vietnam war issue.

But, as Mr. Mansfield pointed out, it may be that the failure to make an earnest, all-out effort to seek a contribution from the UN is the missing link in the restoration of peace in Vietnam. We certainly cannot know unless we try.

Every hour of every day one American college student "succeeds" in committing suicide. For every "success" there are at least nine who fail in attempts to take their own live: to take their own lives.

These figures, shocking though they be, are extremely conservative. It is now thought that suicide is the leading cause of death among college students. Statistics, however, do not fully expose the depth of the problem because any physician is reluctant to label a death as self-inflicted if there is any reasonable doubt as to circumstance or manner.

What is happening in our society that a time so exciting and adventuresome produces so many emotional casualties?


