

So this week you finally finished the last of the turkey soup and hope still lingers that the weatherman will be all mixed up and treat us to another of those fleeting but precious spells of warm weather? So you think Advent has just begun and there is still a bit of a breathing spell until Christmas?

Wake up and live, dear reader, in the world of the downtown merchants and the shopping center merchants and just about any commercial establishment that hopes to cash in on man's financial vulnerability to pseudo-sentiment.

Know you not that we are knee-deep in Christmas, that official Christmas parades were held even before Thanksgiving in Indianapolis and many other communities in the Archdiocese?

Santa Claus has been in town so long that he al-ready has worn out one pair of red breeches sitting around department stores and coaxing frightened tod-dlers onto his lap.

The tinsel and bells, trees and wreaths are begin-ming to look a bit bedraggled. And every salestman worth his commission is warning browsers they had better grab the gaudy baubles while they last. Even the beautiful car

In an effort to retrieve the meaning of Advent and remind us of our spiritual heritage, the American bishops at their Washington meeting took note of worldly concepts which dominate the pre-Christmas weeks:

"Changing customs, especially in connection with preparation for Christmas, have diminished popular appreciation of the Advent season. Something of the holiday mood of Christmas appears now to be anticipated in the days of the Advent season. As a result, this season has unfortunately lost in great measure the role of penitential preparation for Christmas that it once had."

The hishops suggested as a counter-measure to the false gaiety and frenzy of Advent that "we rely on the liturgical renewal and the new emphasis on the liturgical rest to restore its deeper understanding as a season of effective preparation for the mystery of the Nativity."

Christians seeking the true meaning of Advent will spend these few weeks in the spirit and hope of salvation which echoes through the words of the Old Testament prophets and in recalling the authentic roots of the Christmas festivity.

For those Christians, Christmas itself will not come as an anti-climax to the relentless commercialism which has tended to sour the Birthday feast.






