# Dayton U. controversy still rages

DAYTON, Ohio—Clearance of four Catholic professors at the University of Dayton of the charge of advocating positions contrary to Church doctrine has not ended the controversy which erupted late in October and has continued since that time.

The exoneration, announced by the university president, Father Raymond A. Roesch, followed an investigation which was termed a "classic white-wash" by two priests and seven lay faculty members.

The 22-member philosophy de-partment is sharply divided by the dispute. Three of the four accused are members of the department. Of the nine faculty members issuing a "declaration of conscience" objecting to the clearance, eight are in the philosophy department.






