The beautiful Feast of Christmas which we are preparing to celebrate is one of joy and peace, for it commemorates an event which warms with happiness and peace the hearts of men of good will. It was proclaimed to be such by the song of the angels announcing to the shepherds the birth of the

Christ came to bring peace, but the peace which He came to bring peace, but the peace which He came to bring and which He so often invoked upon flis hearers was not that of a freedom from worldly turmoil, political strifes, and international conflicts. His peace was one encompassing the soul and born of a supernatural hope found-ed in the conviction that man is created one day to return to the bosom of his Creator, there to spend an eternity in unspeakable bilss and happiness, and that this destiny is within the grasp of every man of good will. This no earthly turmoil, suffering, or caliastrophe can take from him. This thought caused St. Paul to exclaim: "I reckon that the sufferings of this time are not worthy to be compared to the glory to come." (Rom. VIII, 8) Savior.

The late Father Vaughn puts the same thought in these beautiful words: "To anyone who at all realizes the majesty and the unapproachable glory of God on one hand, and the ineffable tenderness and depth on the other, there is something positively intoxicating in the thought. Peace on earth

F ALL GOES as planned, tomorrow at 7 a m. EST)—it will be Sunday, Dec. 25 in Saigon—the staughter in Vietnam will stop and remain stopped until 7 a m. Monday

The same quiet will descend upon the bloody ground over the New Year week-end and perhaps for four days in early February at the time of the Vietnamese New Year celebration.

In between these brief truces and afterward, the war presumably will continue on its reckless course of escalation. The Vietcong and their North Vietnam allies will resume terrorist attacks on South Vietnam ciliages and their hit-and-run ambushes of American forces. The North Vietnamese troops will resume their battles with the Yanks. The Americans, in their turn, will resume napalm bombing of South Vietnamese villages suspected of harboring Vietcong and their aid raids on the outskirts of Hanoi and Haiphong.

The truces are most welcome. They will give our brave young Americans over there brief respites from the hazards of battle, and many lives will be saved in a war that long ago lost its way.

But the truces also are pathetic gestures of man's essential humanity toward man. Brief halts in the fighting cannot produce opportunities to explore new paths to the conference table. It will be a pity beyond words if Pope Paul's dramatic plea for a 50-day armistice from Christimas through the Vietnamese New Year is shunted aside.

As the Pope said, such an armistice would enable "new ways to be explored for bringing about an honorable understanding putting an end to this conflict." He added that "we are aware that this possibility is favored by influential men." The pontiff has superior sources of information at his disposal and is a man of sound judgment. He should be heeded.

The White House has paid lip service to Pope Paul's proposal, saving the United States stands ready to discuss an extended cease-fire and a temporary freeze on troop reinforcements. But to date it has made public no efforts in that direction, and last week Secretary of State Dean Rusk once again ruled out any prolonged suspension of the bombing of North Vietnam.

The initial truce offer made by the Vietcong, after the White House muffed the chance to make it first, was greeted by official Washington like a dose of cas-tor oil. The Pope's proposal is getting the same re-action.

For their part, the Vietcong and Hanoi also have rejected the Pope's armistice plea in belligerent anti-(Continued on Page 16)






