

If you are having trouble connecting to the ADI-Guest wireless network it could likely be caused by an old password stored on your computer. The password for the guest wireless network is changed every ninety (90) days. You will need to follow the provided steps to be able to reconnect to ADI-Guest with the current password.


The following document will walk you through the steps on how to forget the stored credentials for ADI-Guest wireless network so you can reconnect with new credentials. Included are steps on how to do so with **Windows 7 (Pages 2 – 5)** and **Windows 10 (Pages 6)**.

Windows 7


1) Open the **Start menu** and launch **Control Panel**.




2) Select **Network and Internet** (view setting must be set to Category which can be changed in the top right corner).




3) Select **Network and Sharing Center**



4) On the left side select **Manage wireless networks**.




5) In the network table, find and select **ADI-Guest**, right click, and select **Properties**.



6) Inside of the **Properties** window select the **Security** tab.

7) Enter the new password into the **Network security key** field.



Windows 10

- 1) Open the **Wireless Menu** from the **System Tray**.
- 2) Select **ADI-Guest** to set focus to it.
- 3) Right click on **ADI-Guest** and select **Forget**.
- 4) This will forget the ADI-Guest network and allow you to reconnect to it using the current password.
- 5) To reconnect to **ADI-Guest** open the **Wireless Menu** and select the network and connect. Enter the current password and you should now be connected to ADI-Guest.
