Providing Help through Perry County Food Coalition

Catholic Charities serves as the fiscal agent for the Perry County Food Coalition. This coalition was formed by the United Way of Perry County and brings together all five food pantries in Perry County to share best practices, help each other with problematic issues, and conduct much-needed food drives. Any food collected in a community food drive for the Perry County Food Coalition comes to the Catholic Charities office where it is weighed and then distributed evenly to the participating food pantries. The five food pantries in Perry County also share any monetary donations. The money is placed into an account with the Tri-State Food Bank, allowing the food pantries to purchase needed items at a greatly reduced rate.



Food is a year-round need. 1 in 5 children face food insecurity on a daily basis. Please consider providing help through a non-perishable food drive at your church, work place, or community group. Adoption Awareness

Last year, we launched an Adoption Awareness education campaign in the area. The goal of this campaign is to educate the general public about the option of adoption, which is a loving, selfless act for both birthparents and adoptive parents. While we are not an adoption agency, we do partner with our sister agency in New Albany, St. Elizabeth Catholic Charities, to assist anyone interested in learning more about the adoption process.



In the campaign's first year, we held a gathering with deanery youth and began the education process with them. We had some give-a-ways in the form of car magnets, plastic bracelets, and lapel pins. Thanks to a compassionate and generous supporter, we were also able to have some beautiful billboards proclaiming "Consider Adoption."

On November 16, we will host another gathering with the deanery youth to continue the educational aspects of adoption. Deanery religious education leaders will be sharing the information with their students. We also hope to institute some adoption ambassadors in area high schools, recognizing they are often the first to hear of an unplanned pregnancy among the classmates. These ambassadors can offer a compassionate heart to anyone needing to contact us.
