

Election Day (Nov. 6th) is fast approaching. With each election year, I am often asked "Is there a reason why

our U.S. Bishops do not put out a voter's guide?" Ahhh, but they do... It is called <u>"Forming Consciences for Faithful Citizenship.</u>" It may not be a guide indicating specific candidates to vote for, but it is a wonderful document to assist a voter in forming their conscience on who to vote for based on Catholic moral and social teaching.

"As citizens, we should be guided more by our moral convictions than by our attachment to a political party or interest group. When necessary, our participation should help transform the party to which we belong; we should not let the party transform us in such a way that we neglect or deny fundamental moral truths or approve intrinsically evil acts. We are called to bring together our principles and our political choices, our values and our votes, to help build a civilization of truth and love." (no. 14)

In this short document, the U.S. Bishops speak on how we are called to apply our Catholic teaching, particularly our rich tradition of Catholic Social Teaching, to major issues such as:

Human Life from Conception to Natural Death Promoting Peace Marriage and Family Life Religious Freedom Preferential Option for the Poor Health Care Migration Catholic Education Promoting Justice and Countering Violence Combating Unjust Discrimination Care for Our Common Home Communications, Media, and Culture Global Solidarity

"In making these decisions, it is essential for Catholics to be guided by a well-formed conscience that recognizes that all issues do not carry the same moral weight and that the moral obligation to oppose policies promoting intrinsically evil acts has a special claim on our consciences and our actions. These decisions should take into account a candidate's commitments, character, integrity, and ability to influence a given issue. In the end, this is a decision to be made by each Catholic guided by a conscience formed by Catholic moral teaching." (no. 37)


