The Message of Mercy

Today we can think of the Church as a "field hospital". Excuse me but I repeat it, because this is how I see it, how I feel it is; a "field hospital". Wounds need to be treated, so many wounds! So many wounds! There are so many people who are wounded by material problems, by scandals, also in the Church... People wounded by the world's illusions... We priests must be there, close to these people. Mercy first means treating the wounds. When someone is wounded, he needs this immediately, not tests such as the level of cholesterol and one's glycemic index.... But there's a wound, treat the wound, and then we can look at the results of the tests. Then specialized treatments can be done, but first we need to treat the open wounds, I think this is what is most important at this time. And there are also hidden wounds, because there are people who distance themselves in order to avoid showing their wounds closer. – Pope Francis, Address, March *6*, 2014

The Methods of Mercy

C Yet a question may stir within us: is Baptism really necessary to live as Christians and follow Jesus? A baptized child and an unbaptized child are not the same. – Pope Francis, Audience, January 8, 2014

The Methods of Mercy

If any one of us does not feel in need of the mercy of God, does not see himself as a sinner, it is better for him not to go to Mass! We go to Mass because we are sinners and we want to receive God's pardon, to participate in the redemption of Jesus, in his forgiveness. – Pope Francis, Audience, February 12, 2014

The Methods of Mercy

- Let us place the Sacrament of Reconciliation at the center once more in such a way that it will enable people to touch the grandeur of God's mercy with their own hands. For every penitent, it will be a source of true interior peace. – Pope Francis. Misericordiae Vultus 17
- D cannot say: I forgive my sins. Forgiveness is asked for, is asked of another, and in Confession we ask for forgiveness from Jesus. Forgiveness is not the fruit of our own efforts but rather a gift, it is a gift of the Holy Spirit who fills us with the wellspring of mercy and of grace that flows unceasingly from the open heart of the Crucified and Risen Christ. – Pope Francis, Audience, February 19, 2014

The Methods of Mercy

Do not be afraid of Confession! When one is in line to go to Confession, one feels all these things, even shame, but then when one finishes Confession one leaves free, grand, beautiful, forgiven, candid, happy. This is the beauty of Confession! I would like to ask you — but don't say it aloud, everyone respond in hit heart: when was the last lime vou made your confession? Everyone count, everyone say 'when was the last lime I went to confession? And if much time has passed, do not lose another day. Go, the priest will be good. Jesus is there, and Jesus is more benevolent than priests, Jesus receives you, he receives you with so much love. Be courageous and go to Confession! – Pope Francis, Audience, February 19, 2014

The Mission of Mercy

How can I find the wounds of Jesus today? I cannot see them as Thomas saw them. I find them in doing works of mercy, in giving to the body — to the body and to the soul, but I stress the body — of your injured brethren, for they are hungry, thirsty, naked, humiliated, slaves, in prison, in hospital. These are the wounds of Jesus in our day. We must touch the wounds of Jesus, carees them. We must heal the wounds of Jesus asks us to do with our works of mercy is what Thomas asked: to enter his wounds. – Pope Francis, Homily, July 3, 2013
